

Rostering home (STCA members only)

Rostering home is the commonly used term for industrial action in schools whereby union members do not teach students in a specified year group on a specified day.

The action means that PPTA members will not

- teach students who are in that year level either in year level classes or mixed level classes or groups
- supervise students in those year levels during timetabled teaching and non-contact times

The action does not prevent teachers from

- carrying out administrative tasks associated with the specified year level students
- engaging in extra-curricular activities outside the school day with the specified year level students
- carrying out supervision of students outside the teaching period – for example, during lunch break or after timetabled hours

The decision on whether students in the specified year level are required to attend school on that day is one for the Board of Trustees.

PPTA members cannot be required to teach students in the specified year level, and there is no expectation that the normal teaching programme for those students will operate.

Non-members and day relievers can be used to provide cover during times when PPTA members are not teaching or supervising students in the specified year level, but they may not undertake the teaching of those classes.

Teachers cannot be required to make up the teaching hours later in the year, no matter whether the school is open or closed.

Unless you are notified otherwise by PPTA, the schedule for the rostering home action will be:

Week	Date of action	Year group not taught
6	Tuesday 4 June	Year 9
7	Tuesday 11 June	Year 10
9	Tuesday 25 June	Year 11
10	Tuesday 2 July	Year 12

These will be the dates for the action unless an acceptable offer is received beforehand, in which case notice will be given for the cancellation or deferment.
